BOWLING TECHNICAL REGULATIONS

1. EVENTS

Second SEA DEAF GAMES 2025 will be conducted from August 20 - 25, 2025 and will comprise the following events for both genders.

a. Singles	Six (6) games
b. Doubles	Six (6) games
c. Trios	Six (2x3) games
d. All events	A total of the foregoing 18 games
e. Masters	8 games round robin plus a position round and stepladder final

In Singles, Doubles, and Trios, athletes assigned to commence bowling on odd numbered lanes will move left and athletes assigned to commence bowling on even numbered lanes will move right for each successive game. The ADSF Technical Director will determine the number of lanes to be moved each game during the event.

2. PARTICIPANTS

2.1. Age Eligibility

There are no age restrictions for bowling competitions.

2.2. Number of Players

Each National Federation/Association may enter a maximum number of six (6) men and six (6) women athletes. Players who take part in the youth competition can take participate in this competition.

2.3. Reserves or substitutes

An athlete who has already started in an event shall not be replaced. In case of an injured athlete having to leave the game, the remaining athletes on the team shall continue their games for all event purposes.

2.4. Entry Rules

Only an authorized representative of each NDSF is allowed to submit competition entries.

2.5. Non-Starting

A fine of USD \$10 is levied on each non-starting athlete with the exception of those presenting a doctor's declaration that he/she should not be allowed to start.



3. COMPETITION RULES AND REGULATIONS

3.1. Technical Committee

Indonesian Tenpin Bowling Federation (Persatuan Boling Indonesia) is responsible for the technical organization of the SEA DEAF GAMES 2025

3.2. Committees

3.2.1. Technical Committee

The technical committee will be composed of Technical Director and members appointed by the Organising Committee:

3.3. Competition Rules

The competitions will be conducted in accordance with the International Bowling Federation (IBF) Statues and Playing Rules of the 2019. In case of disagreement in the interpretation of the IBF Statues and Playing Rules, the English text shall prevail. Unforeseen incidents not covered by the 2019 IBF Statues and Playing Rules shall be dealt with as follow:

- 3.3.1. Cases of a general nature will be resolved in accordance with the ADSF Regulations, General Technical Rules - ADSF and this Tenpin Bowling Technical Regulations.
- 3.3.2. Cases of a technical nature related to competition rules will be resolved in accordance with the IBF Rules and Regulations as of March 2019.

3.4. Competition Equipment

All equipment used during competition must comply with the IBF Rules and Regulations.

3.4.1. Bowling Ball Inspection

All participants must submit their bowling balls for inspection to confirm that their weight and other specifications are in compliance with the IBF Playing Rules and regulations. The score of participants bowling with non-registered bowling balls shall be declared invalid. If a bowling ball is removed from the place of the tournament, it must be re-checked bowling in the next event.

3.4.2. Bowling Ball - Altering Surface

Altering the surface of a bowling ball by the use of abrasives or liquids while bowling in a sanctioned competition shall be allowed in accordance to the IBF Statues and Playing Rules Chapter 11. Bowling Balls may be altered before the start of a game or after the completion of the game. Bowling balls may not be altered during the course of a game.

3.5. Competition Clothing

- 3.5.1. Participants must wear competition uniforms representing their nationality, duly registered and published in accordance with the IBF Rules and Regulations as of March 2019.



3.5.2. Participants must observe the ADSF Regulations regarding advertisements on their uniforms and clothing worn in the competition area.

3.6. Draw

The draw for lane assignments for all events will be conducted in accordance with IBF Rules and Regulations.

3.7. Competition Plans

In each of the following events, players assigned to commence bowling on odd numbers lanes will move left and players assigned to commence bowling on even numbered lanes will move right for each successive game. ADSF Technical Director will determine the number of lanes to be moved each game during the event. The men and women shall compete in separate divisions but the scheduled events shall be the same for both as follows:

3.7.1. Singles

Maximum six (6) players per federation. Six (6) games across 18 lanes in one block with two persons from the same country when feasible scheduled per lane. Each game shall be played on different pair of lanes.

3.7.2. Doubles

Maximum three (3) doubles per federation, which players may be scheduled for qualification purposes on the same pair of lanes at the discretion of the Technical Director.

3.7.3. Trios

Maximum two (2) Trios per federation. Six games in two three-games blocks across 18 lanes. Trios from the same federation shall be scheduled on different squads when possible.

3.7.4. All Events

Maximum six players per federation. Standing to be decided based on a total of the 18 played games in the foregoing 3 disciplines (Singles, Doubles and Trios)

3.7.5. Masters

Finals shall be round robin competition between the **Top 8** athletes based on their 8 qualifying games. All qualifying pinfall is dropped. One-game matches will be played. A final match will be played as a position round, making a total of 8 games.

Position number for the pre-arranged schedule shall be decided by draw. (Athletes from the same federation will be scheduled to bowl against each other for 8 games to the extent that is possible.) However, the Technical Committee will select position numbers for athletes from the same federation to ensure such athletes will compete against each other within the 8 games.

Standings shall be based on total pinfall from each of the matches together with a bonus of **10** for each match won, including the position round. Each athlete shall receive a bonus of **5** for a tie and **0** for a loss. Any vacancies that may exist at the start of the Master Finals shall be filled by reserve athletes who are present. Any finalist who has not registered in person for the eight-game block prior to the time specified shall be replaced as described in above. Any vacancies that occur at the start of the Masters Final shall be filled by a pacer and athlete/s who had played against that absent athlete will be given back 10 bonus points in case they have lost to the absent athlete. Athlete playing against the pacer will be given a win.

Masters Events Finals shall be conducted, step-ladder fashion, for three top athletes after the 8 matches to determine the first, second and third positions.



Number three shall play number two, one game total pinfalls to count, beginning from scratch. The winner shall play number one over **two games** total pinfalls to count, starting from scratch. The winner of this match will be declared the Masters Champion.

3.8. Officials

3.8.1. Referee

Allocation of the officials to conduct the event will be made by Indonesian Tenpin Bowling Federation Technical Committee. The officials will possess the ABF/IBF International license valid until the end of 2025. However, officials with the highest level of national accreditation may be assigned.

3.8.2. Appointment

The Organising Committee will appoint Representative of the National Bowling Federation of the country host and an appropriate number of officials to conduct each event.

4. VENUES

4.1. Competition Venues

The 2nd SEA Deaf Games will take place at **the Jaya Ancol Bowling Center**.

4.1.1. Lanes

There will be **40** lanes.

4.1.2. Lane dressing procedures

- Two assigned oil-pattern, i.e., Medium and Long Oil Pattern will be in use during the entire period of the event in accordance with the event.
- The final selected oil-pattern will be announced during the Technical Meeting

4.2. Training Venues

The training venue is the same as the competition venue.

5. SCHEDULES

5.1. Competition Schedule

5.3. Technical Meeting

5.3.1. Date and Location

The Technical Meeting will be held at **21 August 2025 at 14:00 (Jakarta time)** in **the Jaya Ancol Bowling Center**.

5.3.2. Attendance

Each participating National Association may be represented by two officials of whom at least one must be Deaf and, if necessary, an interpreter.

6. CONTROL AND SANCTIONS

6.1. Hearing Devices

The use of any hearing aids/amplification or external cochlear implant parts is strictly forbidden from the restricted zone area.

6.1.1. Restricted Zone Area

The restricted zone areas is in effect from the time athletes enter the competition area during the practice and competition periods.

6.1.2. Violation and Penalty



When this rule is violated, refer to Audiogram Regulations, 8: Violations and Penalties.

6.2. Medical Control

Refer to General Technical Rules = World Championships, WC9 – Control and Sanctions

6.3. Smoking and Drinking

Athletes and their coaches must not smoke, consume alcohol or be under the influence of alcohol while wearing the standard uniform of their national federation in the bowling center during the period commencing with the start of official practice through the completion of the Masters competition.

The penalty for violation of this rule shall be

- A warning for the first violation
- **US\$50.00** For a second violation to be paid by the federation before the next event)
- For any subsequent violation, suspension for the duration of the tournament.

7. PROTESTS AND APPEAL

7.1. Procedure for lodging a protest

7.1.1. Any protest to the ADSF Technical Committee must be written in English on the Official Protest Form. The form must be given to the ADSF Technical Director within one hour after the competition or before the medal presentation.

7.1.2. The ADSF Technical Director will decide whether the protest is sport-related or eligibility - related. The Technical Committee will review all sport-related protests, and the ADSF Representative will review all eligibility-related protests.

7.1.3. Appeal to the Decision of the Technical Committee must be submitted by writing in English to the Protest Committee with a deposit **USD \$50.00**. The decision of the Protest Committee will be final.

7.1.4. The deposit of **USD \$50.00** will be returned to the applicant only if the protest is upheld.

7.1.5. Protests involving eligibility or general playing rules must be confirmed in writing to a responsible tournament official not later than 24 hours after the game in which the infraction occurred or before prize presentation, whichever is the sooner.

7.1.6. When a protest involving a foul or the legality of pin fall is entered, an official representative of the federations involved may be present when evidence is taken relative to the protest.

7.1.7. If no written protest is entered prior to the expiration period as stated, the game or games shall stand as bowled.

7.1.8. Each rule under this rule shall not be construed to cover a similar or previous.

7.2. Appeal

The Protest Committee will meet in the competition venue or a designated office at a time decided upon by the ADSF Technical Director and must be before the Medal Presentation.

7.2.1. The ADSF Technical Director will be the chair of the Technical Committee.

7.2.2. The ADSF Technical Director will be responsible for liaising with the participating teams' officials such as teams' managers and coaches.

7.2.3. After adjudication, the ADSF Technical Director will forward the original Official Protest Form (along with the protest fee if the protest was not upheld) to the ADSF Secretariat.



- 7.2.4. All matters, which cannot be settled by the Referees, shall be heard and reviewed by the Technical Committee. The decision of the Technical Committee is final unless there is an appeal to the Protest Committee within 24 hours after the decision is announced, or before prize presentation, whichever is the sooner.
- 7.2.5. Protests on eligibility arising after the conclusion of the event shall be filed directly with the Protest Committee within 30 days.
- 7.2.6. All appeals from the Technical Committee's decisions must be filed in writing with the Referee or with a member of the Protest Committee. Each appeal must be specific and include a fee of **USD 50.00**. If the Protest Committee does not uphold the appeal, the fee will be forfeited to ADSF Secretariat. The foregoing also applies to protests filed directly with the Protest Committee.
- 7.2.7. The Protest Committee shall be empowered to cite before it all papers and persons involved in the appeal at a regularly scheduled meeting or if deemed appropriate, the Protest Committee may decide an issue by a mail vote after all material involved in the matter has been studied by each of its members.
